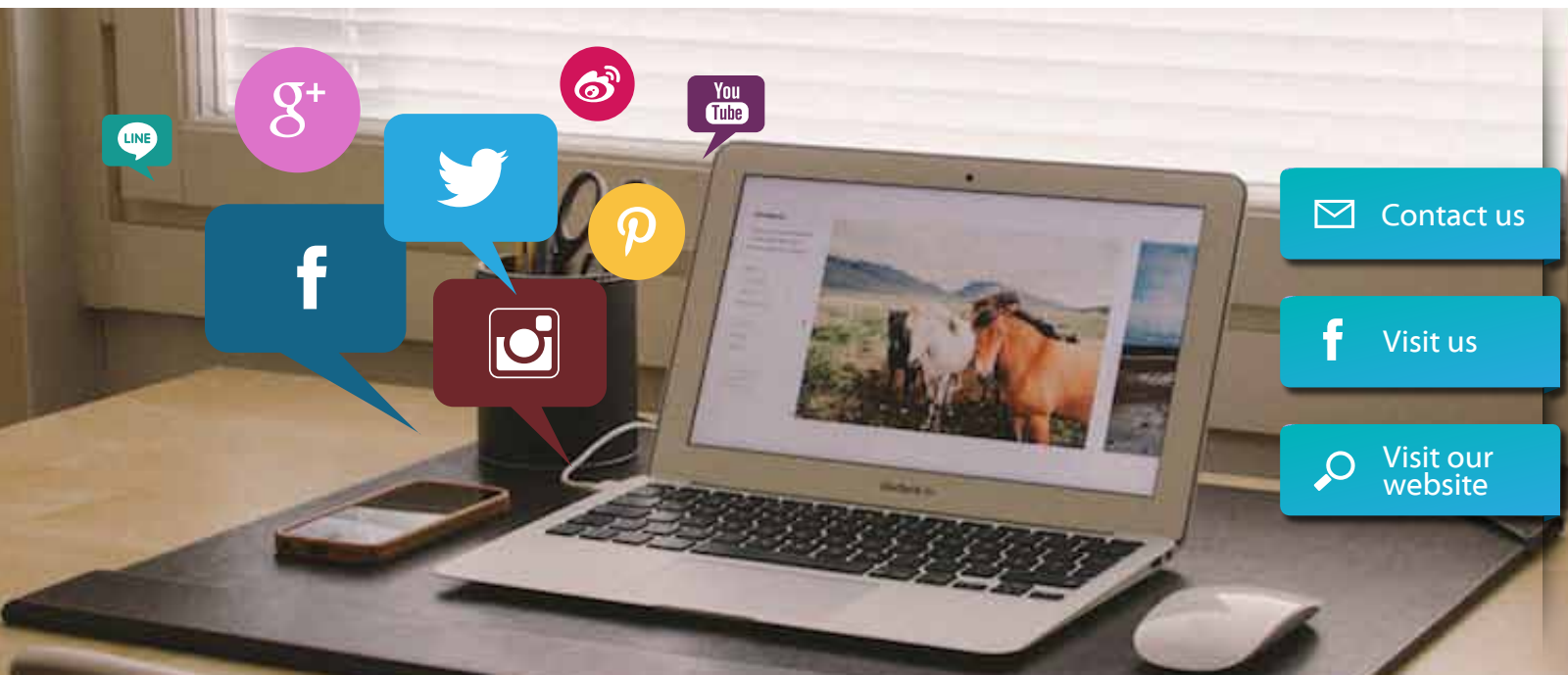


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THIS WEEK'S TOP STORIES ON SOCIAL MEDIA
